Coming down from the Father of light, with whom there is no variation or shifting shadow."

Every good thing bestowed refers to God the giver. Since God is good and perfect, therefore God's gifts are also good and perfect. And, according to this verse, God does not change or shift or vary in his gifts. God is not playing games with us. He does not try to fool us or confuse us. He will always give us just exactly what we need, when we need it.
